

Teaching Suggestions and Answers

General tactics to be used with each reading passage

USING THE WORD CHECK LISTS

- 1. Before you begin a topic, photocopy the Word Check list, or copy it onto the board and see if students can predict what they think the topic of the reading lesson is going to be. Take a vote to see what the majority of students think it is; if there are several different suggestions, see if the students representing one opinion can persuade others from a different group by giving reasons for certain words being in the list. At this stage they don't need to be able to translate all the words. The meanings of some of the words will be deduced from their context in the reading passage.
- 2. Alternatively, you can let students have a copy of the reading passage and allocate one word to each student to research (or more than one if it is a big class). They then return to the class and explain what their word means and also how it is pronounced. This way, the Word Check list is

compiled by the class as a whole. They can also underline other words in the text that they do not know and then find out eople in class can help with explana
