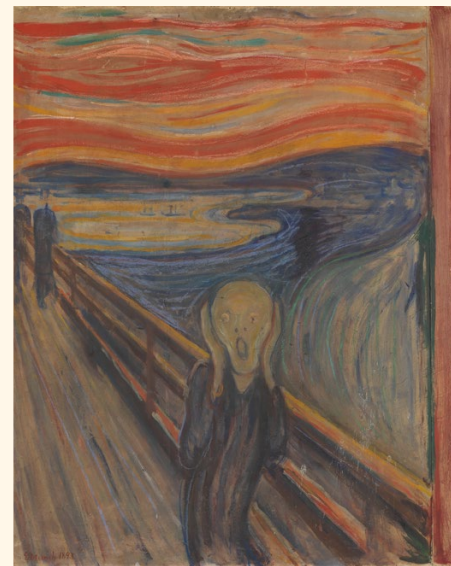
The footballer who stole *The Scream*

In February 1994, Norway was getting ready to host the Winter Olympic Games in the small town of Lillehammer. At the same time, Norway's National Gallery in Oslo was moving its most famous painting, Edvard Munch's *The Scream*, to the ground floor of the building for a special exhibition.

At 6.30 a.m. on the morning of the opening day of the Olympics, two men drove to the National Gallery. They placed a ladder against the wall of the building and climbed up it. Then they broke a window and climbed inside. Less than a minute later, they walked out of the building. One of them was carrying a painting. The painting was *The Scream* and one of the thieves was a former professional football player.

When the alarm went off, the security guard called the police. The police arrived in minutes, but they were too late. The thieves left a postcard in the gallery. It said, "Thanks for the bad security."

While the police were looking for the famous painting, the National Gallery received a message. The thieves were asking for 1 million US dollars for the return of the painting. The Gallery refused to pay. Finally, police officers found the painting and they arrested the thieves. The football player went to prison for six years and three months. Now people in Norway remember him as an art thief, not as a football player.

Can we live forever?



According to official records, Jeanne Calment, a Frenchwoman, lived until she was 122 years old. She ¹witnessed the Eiffel Tower being built in Paris for the 1889 World Fair. She met the artist Vincent Van Gogh while he was living in Arles. She was alive when the first Orient Express trains began running between Paris and Istanbul in 1883. She was there when the Statue of Liberty was made in France and ²shipped to New York in 1885.

So what was the secret to Jeanne's long life? Her parents had had relatively long lives: they had both lived into their nineties. Jeanne, who was ³wealthy, never had to work for a living. She had a comfortable home. She was a keen sportswoman and swam, cycled and played tennis regularly. She had a good ⁴social life with a wide circle of friends. She didn't do any cooking or cleaning herself and never had to worry about money or a job, so she had an easy, stress-free life. She once claimed in a TV documentary, "I have never been ill, never ever." She died of old age in 1997.

But could we do even better than Jeanne and live forever? Ray Kurzweil thinks so. Kurzweil is an American computer scientist. Over his lifetime, he has been ⁵making predictions about technology, and a number of these predictions have now come true. Kurzweil believes technology will help humans live forever. Tiny robots called nanobots will repair damaged cells in the body and ⁶cure diseases like cancer. This has already happened in science fiction: in *Star Trek*, tiny molecular robots called nanites were used to help repair damaged cells. Will we live forever? What do you think?

SO MUCH MORE THAN A CONCERT HALL

The Royal Albert Hall in London is one of the most famous music venues in the world. Frank Sinatra, The Rolling Stones, Beyoncé and Adele have all performed there. Maybe your favourite pop star has performed there too.

Building began in 1867 and the Royal Albert Hall was opened in 1871. Over the 150 years that it has been a concert venue, many famous people have performed on its stage. However, they haven't all been musicians. Albert Einstein gave a speech there in 1933, and Muhammad Ali fought in a boxing match in 1971. In 1991, Japanese sumo wrestlers held a tournament there. It was the first time the tournament was held outside Japan in its 1,500-year history. In 2023, an event was held to raise money for people suffering after the Türkiye and Syria earthquake.

There are hundreds of events a year, including classical music, jazz, circus, rock, pop, opera, dance, choirs, comedy, films, tennis, wrestling and even skateboarding. Yes, skateboarding! Thirty-five of the world's best skaters took part in the competition on the steps outside the Hall.

SO MUCH MORE THAN A CINEMA

You can watch the biggest blockbuster films with a famous orchestra playing the soundtrack. It's definitely a night you'll never forget. The fastest-selling film in a Royal Albert Hall concert was *Jurassic Park*. It was on for four nights and the tickets sold out in 24 hours – all 21,000 of them!

SO MANY SPECIAL MOMENTS

Five weeks after the *Titanic* sank in 1912, a concert was played at the Hall to remember the 1,514 people who died. It was also to remember the eight brave musicians who carried on playing until the ship sank with them.

In 1977, when the pop group Abba played at the Hall, the shows were sold out. The Hall received 3.5 million requests for tickets. That's enough to fill the venue 580 times over.

What concerts will be performed there in the future? Which famous scientists will be invited to speak there? Which sports stars will stand on that incredible stage? We hope the future of the Royal Albert Hall will be as fascinating as its past.
