





Make a parachute*


You need:

- scissors
- string
- a small object, e.g. a little action figure




Do this!

- 1 Cut out a square of about 50 x 50 cm from the plastic bag.
- 2 Cut off the edges* to make a shape with eight sides.



- 3 Make a small hole near the edge of each side.






Many pyramids were built from 2700 BC – 2200 BC in Egypt. This period* is called 'The Pyramid Age'. Pharaohs were always buried in pyramids. The Egyptians believed that after their death they would travel to a land called 'Two Fields'. There, they would need servants and things for a good life. So, during their lives on Earth, Pharaohs spent a lot of time making objects for when they died, for example, little people of stone who could be their servants in the afterlife. Pharaohs also collected many objects so that there would be a lot of treasure for them in their pyramid. Because of this, robbers began to break into the pyramids to steal the treasure.

These robbers were such a big problem that Pharaohs started to bury themselves in hidden tombs. Even today there could still be hidden tombs all over in Egypt.

Each pyramid had a 'pyramid city' – a city around the pyramid where people lived, made goods for, or built the pyramid. They worked and slept there and the Pharaoh gave them homes and food. Sometimes, after finishing the pyramid, people would stay in the city and live there for the rest of their lives.
