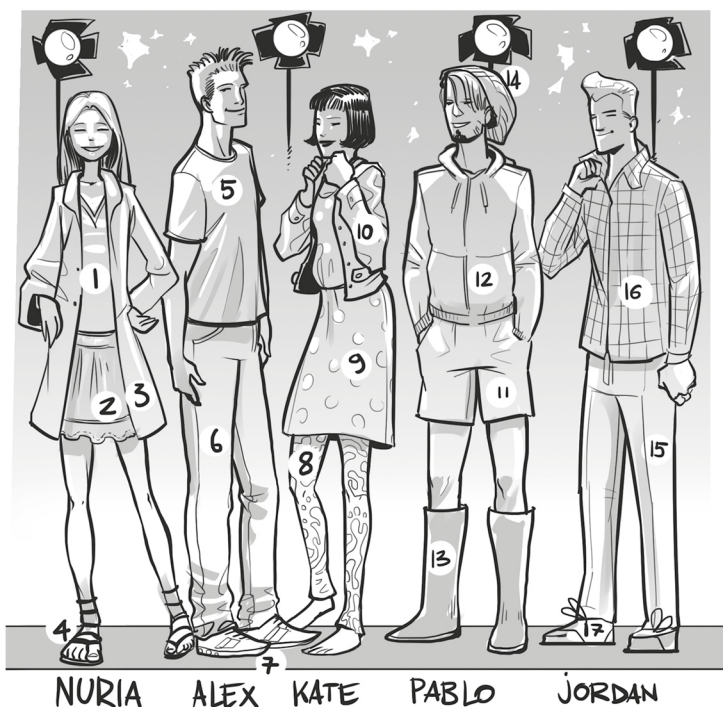

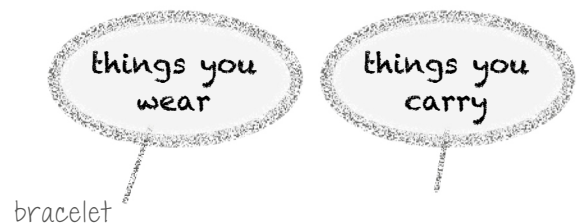

The trip starts when you go through Reception and ride on the special 'travelator'. It's an escalator about 65 metres long, and as you travel along it, you can learn all about the history of Dubai.

Now it's time to start going higher. The journey to the observation point on level 124 is in a very fast lift. It travels at a speed 4 _____ ten metres per second. It's the world's fastest lift.
