The smallest house in America

This house is in

Alexandria, Virginia, a city near the US capital. The house is over one hundred years old (from the 1830s) and is on Queen Street in Old Town. But it is tiny - just 11 m x 2.1 m!

How many rooms are there?

Two - one on each floor! There is a very small living room and one bedroom and one bathroom with a shower on the second floor. There isn't a normal kitchen - just a small sink and counter with a microwave in a tiny closet under the stairs.

What's in each room?

In the living room, there's a couch, a table for four made of wood, and a door to the patio. There are cabinets for food, dishes, and books. The bedroom has a bed for two people, a window, and pictures on the wall. There isn't space for a chair or desk, but there are more cabinets for clothes.

Who lives there?

One man, part-time. He paid \$125,000 for it in 1990 and uses it on the weekends. Perhaps it's too small for everyday life!
