

Sunshine to You

Music and words: Lorenz Maierhofer



Choreography using gestures of the International Sign Language:

- * **sunshine:** The index finger of the right hand is used to draw a circle clockwise in front of the face, and the hand – with the fingers outstretched – is moved from shoulder height (on the left) downwards to the centre of the body (with the palm downwards).
- * **to you:** The hand is held flat and moved outwards horizontally in a semi-circle, anticlockwise and with the palm downwards.
- * **wherever you are:** The backs of the fingers of the right hand are used to stroke the chin gently upwards, twice. The thumb and forefinger then form a circle which is moved outwards to the right of the body and back in a gently rising and falling arc.
- * **whatever you do:** The same gesture as for “wherever you are”.
- * **God:** The right index finger is pointed upwards.
- * **bles:** The outstretched index and middle fingers of the right hand – held together horizontally, one above the other – make the sign of the cross at chest height.
- * **you:** The same gesture as for “to you”.
- * **good rain:** The fingers of the right hand, moving to simulate raindrops, are allowed to fall from head height to the centre of the body.
- * **soft winds:** The outstretched index and middle fingers of the right hand – with the fingertips pointing upwards – are used to describe two anticlockwise circular movements.
